

## VILLAGE OF PALMYRA PARKS

The Village of Palmyra maintains four public parks that host a variety of different activities throughout the year to come and enjoy.



Palmyra Village Park is a 13 acre park located on the southwest end of town, with a pavilion and kitchen that is available for rent throughout the spring, summer and fall months. The park also has a tennis court, basketball court, two sand volleyball courts, four sets of horseshoe pits, a softball and baseball field, as well as many different sets of playground equipment. Public restrooms are available at this park.



Lower Spring Lake is a 104 acre, 13' deep lake with a public boat launch located on the north shore, accessible from STH 59. Lower Spring Lake specializes in blue gill and largemouth bass for those looking to come and enjoy some fishing. The Palmyra Beach is an area with 100' of sandy frontage on the west end of Lower Spring Lake. The Palmyra Beach has a playground, beach house and pavilion that overlook the swim area. The pavilion is available for rent and a paved parking lot is located on the east end of the park to accommodate visitors. During the summer months there are two rafts placed in the swim area to entertain swimmers. The Palmyra Park and Recreation Department also makes swimming lessons available during the summer months at the Palmyra Beach.



The Mini Park is a half-acre park located just south of Main Street, on S. Second Street. Its easy accessibility from the downtown area and close proximity to the Municipal parking lot, make this park a choice spot to enjoy a lunch on its shaded picnic tables.

There is a hitching post for riders to tie off horses on while visiting Palmyra from Horserider's Campground, which is located just south of the Village on Little Prairie Road (3<sup>rd</sup> Street). During the winter months, the Mini Park also serves as a parking area for anyone who is stopping in Palmyra off of the local snowmobile trail.



All Scout Park is located adjacent to the Village Hall on the corner of Mill Rd. and First Street. The timber framed Boy Scout Cabin is the focal point of this park, and is the meeting place for the local Scout troops. There is also a picnic table available to sit on and relax in the shade.



Deep Rock Spring is a historical site in the Village of Palmyra, which is also accessible to the public. The area around the spring was originally developed in the 1880's as a place to access its healing waters. The waters from the spring were also pumped to the spa that was located just west of Lower Spring Lake, as well as to the railroad. Once at the railroad, it was bottled and used either on the railroad cars or shipped to markets in Milwaukee and Chicago. Concrete and landscaping work, as well as the addition of a placard telling of its history, was completed in 2005 by the Palmyra Historical Society. Deep Rock Spring is accessible from Jefferson Street (CTH E), where parking is available.
